# Attitudes to School Survey 2025

In term 4, we will work with the students to develop strategies to improve our practice, particularly in the areas of 'Learner Characteristics and Disposition' and 'Social Engagement'

All Victorian government schools are required to participate in the Attitudes to School Survey (AtoSS). The survey invites students from Year 4 to Year 12 to share their views and experiences of school. The survey gathers valuable insights into how students feel about their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life at school more broadly. AtoSS is aligned with the Department of Education's Framework for Improving Student Outcomes (FISO) 2.0. The information collected supports schools and the department to plan for improvement and strengthen student learning and wellbeing.
