Dear Parents and Carers

William Ruthven Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of our school's voluntary financial contributions for 2024.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that is through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

The financial contributions of families in the past have allowed us to:

- Update our school's reading program
- Provide more hand-on materials for problem solving in mathematics
- Establish a robotics program
- Purchase materials to support creativity and exploration in our art and science programs
- Ensure all students have access to sports equipment to develop active and healthy children.

A parent portal is available to purchase the 2024 stationery packs through Rapid Office Supplies. The stationery packs have been capped at a maximum of \$30.00 per student. The school has negotiated special 'back to school' pricing with Rapid Office Supplies resulting in an overall **20% - 30% discount**.

The stationery items are for your child to individually own and use at school. The portal for purchasing the stationery packs will remain open until Friday, 8 December. The portal website is: https://schoolpacks.com.au/wrps.

Your child's stationery pack will be delivered to the school in January 2024. Classroom teachers request that the stationery packs stay at school for labelling (that is, <u>not</u> collected/taken home).

If purchasing from stationery supplies directly from the school after 8 December, a \$12.95 administrative fee will be added to the cost of each stationery pack.

Curriculum and other contributions are listed on page 2, with information about how to make payment for these contributions on page 4. The school would appreciate payment for these contributions to be made by Friday, 8 December.

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g., textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
